2016 MAKING AN IMPACT

It has been a busy year for Signature Health! We have all worked very hard so we can continue to grow, improve, and provide more services to more people. Signature Health today is in a great position to positively impact how behavioral healthcare is delivered in northeast Ohio.

I offer a huge "Thank you!" to my incredible staff, our board, and all our community supporters for their hard work and continuing belief in our mission. Without a team, a goal is just a dream. These are the folks who make it possible to achieve our goals.

A LOT HAPPENED IN 2016.

On January 1, 2017 Signature Health merged with Connections and Orca House. With the merger, Signature Health has substantially scaled up as a regional behavioral healthcare provider. Our internal knowledge base is greatly increased, our staff skill sets have expanded, and we can serve more people in more communities.

In 2016 we opened our own lab, providing us with the ability to analyze our own urine screens, blood work, and other lab testing. It's a significant step forward, shortening the timelines for receiving patient results as well as offering more control over accuracy and accountability.



The biggest news, and the most significant change, is on December 15th, 2016, we were officially designated a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC). This is a game changer. Now we shift from a narrow focus on behavioral health to a much broader holistic focus on health and wellness for people with behavioral health issues. As an FQHC we will be able to expand our services and broaden their scope. Right now that means expanding into primary care and pediatrics. Our long-term vision includes providing dentistry, obstetrics and vision care. With the FQHC designation we gain access to federal resources that allow us to really help people who are indigent and under-insured.

With regard to the possible repeal or replacement of the Affordable Care Act in the coming year: let us be thoughtful and measured in our approach. Figure out replacement before a repeal. On behalf of the millions of people in our country who suffer from mental illness and addiction, we must get this right. Lives are at stake.

Signature Health will continue to pursue our mission to impact the way behavioral healthcare is delivered in northeast Ohio. And we will not forget that we serve the forgotten.

Garfield Heights Office

Our Garfield Heights location enhanced its ability to serve the community in many ways in 2016. Highlights include:

- Increased pharmacy hours and staff to include evening coverage
- Expanded Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) programming, including three additional IOP groups (for a total of seven), two additional aftercare groups, evening IOP hours, induction group, and CPST services
- Started an engagement group to provide three times weekly services and continued medications to clients waiting for a residential treatment bed
- Hired an Addictionologist to serve as the agency's director of MAT
- Increased the number of treatment slots for clients needing MAT for opiate addiction. In addition to treating more patients, this increase has also reduced the wait time for clients to start ambulatory detoxification
- Expanded intake department to include walk-in CPST, walk-in Counselor, and an Intake Coordinator with the goal of improving client retention and engagement and providing outreach and linkage
- Implemented dual PHP program for clients with mental health and addiction issues
- Became a partner with the Cleveland Food Bank
- Provided specialized training for staff in the areas of motivational interviewing sexual awareness assessments and services, and EMDR
- Expanded child psychiatry services
- Held the first annual client art show
- Hosted a client holiday party
- Hired a walk-in Case Manager to help clients apply for Medicaid and other entitlements
- Expanded Primary Medicine services

NEW IN 2016

FQHC Designation: New Access Point Grant

Signature Health was designated as a FQHC (Federally Qualified Health Center).

On December 15, 2016 the Department of Health and Human Services awarded over \$50 Million for new FQHC sites. Signature Health Willoughby became one of 75 grant recipients in the United States, and one of only four in Ohio, accepting a grant of \$812,500.

Security

In 2016 we decided to start our own Security Company. Here are some of the highlights:

On-Site Lab Services

Signature Health implemented critical laboratory services in 2016.

MARTTI

Deployed the MARTTI (My Accessible Real-Time Trusted Interpreter) in all Signature Health locations. MARTTI provides a real-time video link from each location to trained medical interpreters at any time of day, every day of the year.

Paul's House

We opened the doors to Paul's House on June 2nd, 2016. Highlights include:
